

Information about admission to the Doctoral School in the Humanities within the project “How do we love? Romantic love and cultural capital among urban middle class in Indian metropolises” (Polish National Science Centre grant, OPUS 19 scheme, no. 2020/37/B/HS3/04074, principal investigator: Anna Romanowicz, Ph.D.).

Jagiellonian University unit: Institute of Ethnology and Cultural Anthropology (Department of History) and the Doctoral School in the Humanities.

Job title: Ph.D. student within the project “How do we love? Romantic love and cultural capital among urban middle class in Indian metropolises”.

Responsibilities within the Polish National Science Centre project: Research tasks undertaken for the project (“How do we love? Romantic love and cultural capital among urban middle class in Indian metropolises”) have to be a basis for Ph.D. thesis. Ph.D. student is required to make these tasks a main topic of his/her research until the principal investigator will find them completed/asses them as completed. Basic responsibilities of the Ph.D. student will include discourse analysis (policies, legal documents, novels, blog entries, memes, movies, TV shows, news, etc.) and qualitative analysis of these data (as per guidelines of the principal investigator; within the project’s thematic scope).

Additionally, the Ph.D. student will be required to:

- a. present the results of her/his research in at least two academic articles published in international, peer-reviewed journals (recognized on the official list by the Polish Ministry of Science and Higher Education);
- b. present the results of her/his research in at least two international conferences;
- c. present the results of her/his research in periodical reports submitted to the principal investigator;
- d. catalogue (and digitalize – if there is a need) data collected for the project;
- e. regularly participate in the team meetings, which most often will focus on discussions about relevant literature and data collected;
- f. prepare entries for the project’s blog (as per guidelines of the principal investigator);
- g. popularize the knowledge gained from working for the project in the media (subject to possibilities) and on public meetings (for example public lectures);
- h. take an active part in two seminars related with the project’s topic (organized by the principal investigator in 2022 and 2023).

Additional responsibilities, within the project, might be assigned by the principal investigator in consultation with the Ph.D. student.

During the project, the Ph.D. student will have received substantive support both from his/her Ph.D. supervisor, and the principal investigator. Consultations with specialists from the research

institutions abroad, especially from the South Asian University and University of Tezpur, will be possible as well.

Terms of employment: The Ph.D. student will receive doctoral scholarship as per Polish law, within 3-years program in the Doctoral School in the Humanities. More information:
