

Recruitment Criteria

The recruitment for doctoral stipend withing the project *After Climate Crisis. Non-Scalable Survival Strategies in Speculative Fabulations of the Last Two Decades* follows the criteria established by the appropriate ruling of the Senate of Jagiellonian University 105/XI/2021 from 24th November 2021 concerning recruitment in the Doctoral School in the Humanities UJ in academic year 2022/2023 and the requirements of National Science Center.

Formal Criteria:

1. The candidate must meet the criteria enumerated in art. 186, Paragraph 2 of the Resolution.
2. Only complete applications will be submitted for assessment.

Recruitment criteria withing the project *After Climate Crisis. Non-Scalable Survival Strategies in Speculative Fabulations of the Last Two Decades*:

1. A description of the draft research plan tightly connected with research tasks and the main theme of the project
2. The candidate must possess:
 - Documented knowledge of theories and practices of transdisciplinary studies
 - The draft plan of dissertation which testifies to the candidate's awareness of the problem of speculative fabulations in the context of current climatic and environmental problems
 - Excellent command of the Polish language and good working knowledge of the English language on a level appropriate for writing scholarly articles for publication in quality academic journals.
 - Experience in scholarly work and the willingness to develop academic competences through publications, participation in conferences and promotional activities

Recruitment process will be divided into two stages.

In the **first stage** the following are assessed:

1. Summary of the project in English (1800 characters with spaces)
2. Detailed justification for the choice of the Jagiellonian University Unit in which the project will be carried out
3. Opinion of a member of senior academic staff
4. Description of the project in Polish or English (at the Applicant's choice): a minimum of 7200

and a maximum of 8000 characters with spaces. Limited number of characters does not apply to literature section. The description should include: major aim(s)/objective(s) of the research project, research problem and working hypotheses; state of the art; research justification, with the impact of the project on the development of the discipline highlighted; research methodology; and relevant literature (0-60 points)

5. A sample, solely authored text which is a testimony to the candidate's research competence, in the language indicated as the language of the recruitment procedure, 18 000 characters maximum (0-30 points)

6. CV with additional achievements (scholarships, publications, conference papers, nonacademic professional experience, etc.) (0-10 points)

Candidates who have obtained a minimum of 60 points from the first stage are admitted to **stage two** of recruitment procedure (the interview). In the second stage, the commission conducts an interview which takes the following course:

1. presentation of a doctoral project (maximum 10 minutes);
2. an interview with committee members.
